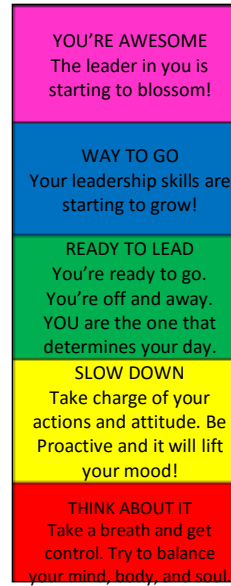

- NFP provides high quality curriculum and instruction using challenging state academic standards.
- Differentiated Instruction is provided through Guided Reading, Guided Math, and support from Special Education and Title I Services.
- Assessments are used to monitor student academic progress and guide instruction. These include Next Step Guided Reading Assessment, Star Math, and Pre-C Math Assessment.
- Standard Based Report Cards inform parents of their child's progress each 9-weeks.

What is Title I?

Nutter Fort Primary is a Title I School. Title I is a federally funded program designed to give educational assistance to students living in areas of poverty. The funds provide instructional materials, additional learning time opportunities, parent and family engagement activities, and professional development for teachers.

The teachers and administration have developed a comprehensive Behavior Plan to support students in monitoring their own behavior. Each classroom has a Clip Chart. Positive behavior is rewarded as clips are moved up the chart. Negative behavior has students move their clip down the chart. A student has the opportunity to move their clips back up during the day by their positive behaviors.



NFP is a Leader in Me School that supports the 7 Habits of Happy Kids:

1. Be Proactive
2. Begin with the End in Mind
3. Put First Things First
4. Think Win-Win
5. Seek First to Understand, Then to be Understood
6. Synergize
7. Sharpen the Saw



A Message From . . .

Kindergarten: Our Kindergarten classrooms are active learning environments where important concepts are learned by doing meaningful hands-on activities. Reading nightly and providing parental support for completion of homework will help your child to have a successful year in Kindergarten.

First Grade: The first grade at NFP provides a unique learning environment that is made up of experiences to enhance and foster the foundations of literacy, mathematics, science, history, and the arts. We will use whole group, small group, and individual instruction to accomplish our goals. Assessment is ongoing and drives our instruction.

Second Grade: Second grade students will become independent, academically and socially. The teachers' expectations will include: emptying their own morning folder, turning in the appropriate work, following class and school rules, and becoming role models for the Kindergarten and First graders. The students will exhibit the seven habits in school and at home, as well as become bucket fillers.
