HARRISON COUNTY SCHOOLS WILL CONTINUE TO OPERATE ON A 1-HOUR DELAY, AND A 30-MINUTE EARLY DISMISSAL.

Each grade will attend 2 days of in-person instruction.


The remaining 3 days will be remote instruction.

**Update to Harrison County's Re-Start Plan as a result of the actions taken by the West Virginia State Board of Education during their regular meeting held on Wednesday, January 13, 2021 at 11:00 a.m.**

**Below are the mandates set forth by the West Virginia Board of Education and those to which Harrison County Schools shall comply:**

- The WV Board of Education mandates a return of students to in-person learning and to ensure that students, teachers, and staff can do so safely regardless of the WVDHHR Map for Pre-K through 8<sup>th</sup> grades. Grades 9 through 12 will return to in-person learning if the WVDHHR map is not red on Saturday.
- To continue to ensure that schools remain safe for students, teachers, and staff, education leaders at the local level are directed to continue monitoring and enforcing the WVDE's six identified mitigation strategies, especially mask wearing.
- Parents will continue to have the ability to choose a virtual learning option for their children.

**How these mandates effect Harrison County Schools:**

**For all PreK-8 students in Harrison County:**

- All PreK-8 students will resume the two-day blended in-person instructional model on January 25, 2021. **Counties do not have the option to implement full remote learning for PreK-8 students.**
- A local county board of education retains the authority to work with local health officials and to close individual classrooms or schools when a specific health need related to that classroom or school is identified.

**For all students in grades 9 through 12 in Harrison County:**

- High schools will resume the two-day blended in-person instructional model on January 25, 2021 unless Harrison County is red on the Saturday DHHR County Alert System map.
- Consistent with the practice that has been in place since the start of the 2020-2021 school year, high schools will move to remote learning the day after the county turns red on the daily DHHR County Alert System map.
- High schools will stay in remote learning until the following Monday.
- If the county is not red on the DHHR daily map on Saturday, two-day in-person instruction will resume on the following Monday.
- A local county board of education retains the authority to work with local health officials and to close individual classrooms or schools when a specific health need related to that school or classroom is identified.

**Harrison County Schools will remain on the two-day blended model until such time that all staff has had the opportunity to receive both doses of the Covid-19 vaccine or the WVDHHR Saturday Map is green along with a recommendation from the Harrison County Health Department that it is safe to return to a 5-day in-person instructional model. Harrison County Schools appreciates our employees and families and will continue to work openly and honestly to move in a positive direction in the upcoming months.**
